Drawing on a range of successful pilot projects run by the Departments of Politics, Economics, English Literature and Chemistry the GRASS project will support the use of screen capture technology in order to enable further adoption of innovative approaches including 'the flipped classroom' and study support screencasts but also video feedback, module summaries, the use of screencasts for assessment and a wide range of other uses.
